

## COSTI IMMIGRANT SERVICES LAUNCHES ONLINE AUCTION TO EXPAND FUNDRAISING

## **AUCTION SET TO START NOVEMBER 24, 2006**

**(Toronto) – November 20, 2006** – COSTI is taking its fundraising to a whole new level by launching an online auction available to Internet shoppers around the world.

"By taking our fundraising online, we're reaching out to people we otherwise wouldn't be able to speak to" said Mario J. Calla, COSTI's Executive Director. "It's a chance for us to get our message out and earn greater revenues so we can, in turn, help more people."

The online auction will be held from **November 24<sup>th</sup> to December 8<sup>th</sup>**, and anyone with an Internet connection can participate by visiting **www.gobid.ca**. At any point in the auction, people can log on, browse for items and bid on goods or services they're interested in.

"Items have been donated by businesses and individuals who generously support our organization and the work we do" said Mario Calla. "We're ecstatic that they believe in this auction as a way of bringing in much needed revenue for our organization."

COSTI has partnered with GoBid, Canada's leading supplier of online auctions for not-for-profit organizations. GoBid provides high-level technical security for both COSTI and bidders, so all online transactions are protected.

Online auctions are becoming more accepted by shoppers. Moving online is the natural next step in charity fundraising. "It's a perfect situation: people can get some deals thanks to the generousity of donors; and organizations like COSTI can tap in to a whole new revenue stream. It works for everyone", said Peter Glazier, General Manager of Development for COSTI.
